Letter from our Associate Rector, Rev. Mike Madden:

Dear Friends,

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" (John 20:19)

I am writing this letter after Easter and before Pentecost, which puts us roughly where the disciples were after they found the empty tomb. Despite the rumours and first-hand accounts of Jesus rising from the dead the disciples were still very fearful. Indeed, they had experienced quite a rollercoaster ride of emotions. Over the last few days, the disciples had seen and experienced many things; Jesus' entry into Jerusalem to cries of Hosanna! A mock trial; Feet washing; The last supper, and then Jesus' death on a cross at the hands of the Romans. They were jumpy, they were scared, they were wondering if the next knock at the door would herald their arrest, even their death. Jesus their leader had been crucified, his body was missing, some disciples thought Jesus had risen from the dead others were not so sure. Judas was also dead, and Thomas was missing.

At one level the disciples fear was reasonable based on the facts as they knew them, but they did not have the whole picture. They did not know for sure that Jesus had risen from the dead and they had very little idea of the cosmic victory that Jesus had won on the cross, defeating sin and death. So, they locked the doors and hid!

So, it is against this atmosphere of fear that Jesus literally stepped in. In John 20:19 it says...' ¹⁹ Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!"' So, here we have a room full of fearful disciples who had locked the doors when suddenly Jesus came and stood among them. The first thing Jesus says is shalom, "peace". In one sense it is the everyday greeting of Jewish people. It means "good health, harmony, happiness, everything you wish for yourself and everything God wants for you." It is a normal wish, a traditional greeting, but when Jesus says it, it carries more gravitas, in fact a lot more gravitas. This is Jesus, the Son of God, who spoke the word and the universe was created, so it means so much more. To quote from the lyrics of the song 'So will I" by Hillsong Worship.

'And as You speak a hundred billion galaxies are born, in the vapor of your breathe the planets form'

So yes, when Jesus appears in our midst and says "Shalom" it carries weight, because Jesus is the Prince of peace. The second thing Jesus did was breathe on the disciples saying, 'Receive the Holy Spirit,' which would ultimately empower the disciples changing them from fearful men hiding behind locked doors to fearless men preaching the gospel with boldness, quite a transformation.

We currently live in a world where there is a lack of peace, it is easy to get anxious and stressed especially with the 24-hour live news feeds we get. My encouragement to us all is to try and find a few minutes each day, away from the background noise of life, away from our busy lives to sit quietly and draw near to Jesus the Prince of peace, to receive '...the peace of God, which transcends all understanding' and allow him to fill you with his Holy Spirit.



Farewell to departing Councillors

There will be no election for Parish Councillors in May, as only 6 nominations have been received. Sadly we will be saying goodbye to 3 retiring councillors, who have all used their unique skills to work hard for the benefit of the village community:



Bill Phillips has been a Parish Councillor for an incredible 40 years - he has seen many changes, and has been a steady balancing force ensuring continuity as councillors came and went over the years. Andrew Bird has been a committed Parish Councillor since May 2021, Stewart Ainsley kindly stepped into the breach last year when we were 2 councillors down. We would like to thank you all for your commitment and efforts on behalf of the village and wish you all the very best.

New Parish Council

As of the 7th May the new Parish Council will take over. Five councillors are continuing to serve and we would like to welcome our new councillor, Moth Clark. Thank you so much for joining us.

Now is your opportunity to come along and join us - we need 2 more councillors ideally - this is a chance to learn more about how the village is run and take part in its future. Maybe come to one of our meetings to help you decide - or email fayf.fpc@gmail.com

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting is coming up on **Friday 10th May, 7.30pm start** - we hope that as many of you as possible can be there. We are trialling a new set up, starting with a few short presentations including the launch of the Freeland Village Design Statement, which will be your chance to have a say over the future of Freeland, and a briefing on the local Low Carbon Hub. Then the main part of the evening will be more informal with time to explore displays by village groups and organisations.

Pigeon House Lane

Pigeon House Lane entrance works have been completed and we would like to thank Councillor Liam Walker for his support, including OCC funding, to enable the works to go ahead. This will hopefully ease some of the issues along Pigeon House Lane.

20mph Scheme

The public consultation on this has been delayed, as we want to incorporate the potential 40 to 30mph reduction along the A4095. Oxfordshire County Council will need to carry out traffic surveys along the A4095 before this can be included.

Bins

We have changed over waste bin collections, moving across to The Shield Group, instead of WODC, for all the Parish council owned bins. This will represent a saving on costs by up to 70% per bin. During the changeover there may be some issues with who is responsible for which bin, but this will get easier over the next few weeks. If there are any issues with bin collections at the play park, Garden of Remembrance or around the Village Hall please let us know.

Fix My Street

We are very lucky to have 2 defibrillators in our village. One is located by Freeland Primary School in the old telephone box. The other is located on the left hand side of the Freeland Village Hall entrance porch. Green tip

The world-leading study, State of Nature, recently found no let-up in the decline of our wildlife, with one in six species at risk of being lost from Great Britain. This is in part caused by loss of habitat across the country. For example, we've lost approximately 97% of flower-rich meadows since the 1930's, and with them gone so is the vital food needed by pollinators, like bees and butterflies. Despite the UK government continuing to miss its own targets for protecting nature, all is not lost. As a community we can help protect our precious wildlife, or rather your lawn can help! A healthy lawn with some long grass and wildflowers benefits wildlife, tackles pollution and can even lock away carbon below ground. With over 20 million gardens in the UK, even the smallest grassy patches add up to a significant proportion of our land which can deliver enormous gains for nature, communities, and the climate.

This month's green tip is not something that needs to be done, but rather something that we need not do! For the month of May don't cut some, or better still all, of your lawn (sign up for No Mow May at www.plantlife.org.uk). May is precious when it comes to wildflowers such as daisies and dandelions. By leaving them to grow in the lawn, we can ensure that insects have fresh nectar to feed on as they wake from their winter slumbers. And perhaps on the Sundays when you would normally start the mower, instead take some time to sit with your favourite beverage watching your garden, and the insects and avian visitors that come to feast.

UPDATE ON BARNARD GATE JUNCTION


