

ST MARY'S CHURCH BELLS

If you have been out enjoying an early Sunday morning walk, and with the wind in the right direction, you may have heard Combe bells ringing for the permitted 15 minutes before service. Likewise, if you have been undertaking a lap of Blenheim, the bells of Bladon and Woodstock would have caught your ear. This may have had you wondering why you haven't heard St Mary's bells ringing recently?

Each tower in the country had to undertake a risk assessment and maintenance check of the bells before a return to ringing could be contemplated. Whilst St Mary's bells are in fine working order, the proximity of the bells in the very compact ringing room means we do not meet the safe distancing guidelines and hence are unable to return to ringing at this point in time.

Our Church is now OPEN FOR PUBLIC MASS but only on Saturday night at 5.00pm and Sunday morning at 10.00am.

Everyone has to be masked and appropriate hygiene and social distancing measures are in place with stewards on duty to make sure everyone keeps to the Regulations. Capacity is limited so the Church only opens 15 minutes before each Mass and it is possible that if you come at the last minute there might not be room for you.

FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

As expected, there is still no news of when Club meetings can be held again. Jill will keep us informed of any changes and what the Committee plan to do. The Committee will be discussing what form the Annual General Meeting in October will take.

Gardening continues regardless of Covid-19 and many of us have had more time to spend outdoors. We hope many have enjoyed produce from their gardens such as vegetables, apples, pears and plums, and soft fruit such as blackcurrants and blackberries, strawberries and raspberries. After the long dry spell we have had plenty of rain which has helped to swell the fruits. Tomatoes in the greenhouse are also coming to an end. If a ripe tomato is placed with a group of green ones, perhaps on a window sill, the green ones will also ripen.

Autumn has certainly arrived which means it is a good time to take stock of our beds, cut down spent flowers, remove annuals as they finish flowering, and generally see what has worked this year and plan for the future. Bulbs have arrived and most of these can be planted out when purchased. It is often worth planting tulips a bit later to prevent tulip blight. It is quite satisfying to clear the beds ready for next year's planting. When clearing vegetable beds one can plant green manure to cover the bare space. This is dug in when spring comes to fertilise the soil. Home composting is also a good way to turn green waste into useful organic matter to spread round the garden.

FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL - LISA'S NOTES - SEPTEMBER 2020

As I type these notes our last meeting was held on **20th July** and our next meeting is on **21st September**, so here is a brief update.

Parish Council meetings

Coronavirus - an update

The central phone line **01993 651330** has now been cancelled and will no longer operate.

For anyone who is particularly worried about managing with prescription collections after this time, please speak to the pharmacy on **01993 880351** to see if you can be put on their list for direct deliveries from them.

Following on from my list of 'thank yous' last month, I realised that I had forgotten to thank our **District Councillor Merilyn Davies**, (sorry!) who helped to get the Co-op delivery service agreed and up and running, and also liaised with Blenheim to enable the loan of a delivery van. Thank you Merilyn, this service was brilliant and much appreciated by those who were not able to leave the house for their essential shopping.

We have decided to keep the food bank going for the time being, so please continue to donate as and when you can (non-perishable goods only please). My thanks to everyone who has donated items to the food bank, your help has been greatly appreciated.

Recycling bins at Riely Close, Long Hanborough

I have been advised that following a request from Hanborough Parish Council, WODC will be removing the recycling bins from the car park in Riely Close. This is due to an increase in fly tipping that has become out of control, despite them being emptied three times a week, and overflowing bins,

The bins will be collected on Friday 18th September, after which there will no longer be recycling collections from this point.

Once they are removed, WODC and Hanborough Parish Council will look at ways of improving the car park. Currently there are alternative recycling sites at Sainsbury's and Woodford Way car park, (behind Marriott's Walk/Witney Hospital), and also at Dix Pit. Stanton Harcourt.

Salt Cross Garden Village

The Council have been advised that when the Garden Village is built, there will be a change in priority at the Cuckoo Lane junction included in the plan to deter vehicles coming through Freeland from the A40. In the plan, it states "Measures to deter through traffic travelling between the A40 and A4095 via Cuckoo Lane and Freeland Village. A change in priority on Cuckoo Lane to discourage traffic routing through Freeland village must be provided and technologies to support monitoring of the effectiveness of this will be required."

Dog's mess around Freeland

Time for a moan I'm afraid! I've had several residents mention to me recently about dog's mess in the village which has gradually been getting worse over the past few months. Particular areas of concern are the path around the corn field at the back of Broadmarsh Lane, the playing field and the footpaths in the woods. I know it is just a minority of people who don't clear up after their four-legged friends, but it spoils it for the rest of us and it is a health hazard, especially for young children. Please, please use the dog bins provided around the village and scoop the poop! Thanks!

Speeding in Freeland

It is a sad fact that speeding is still very much prevalent in the village, often committed by our own residents! Our Speedwatch Team are hoping to resume their activities soon, but can I please ask everyone to just slow down and watch their speed, in particular around the school area and church and pub/village hall area where there are some nasty blind bends and parked cars. The Parish Council is hoping to have a traffic survey carried out in the near future to try and establish how much traffic is currently coming through the village and to see what other measures can be taken to help reduce traffic and speeding through Freeland. I will keep you updated on any progress.

Planning for the future - Government White Paper

The government has issued a number of planning consultations and a call for evidence. The most important of which is Planning for the Future, a White Paper with radical and far reaching proposals. There are numerous changes being proposed to the current planning system, too many to mention here, but the four main proposals are:

- revisions to the standard method for assessing local housing need, which as well as being a proposal to change guidance in the short term has relevance to proposals for land supply reforms set out in *Planning for the Future*;
- securing of First Homes, sold at a discounted market price for first time buyers, including key workers, through developer contributions in the short term until the transition to a new system. This was consulted on in February and they are now asking about the detail:
- temporarily lifting the small sites threshold below which developers do not need to contribute to affordable housing, to up to 40 or 50 units to support SME builders; in designated rural areas it is proposed to maintain the current threshold;
- extending the current Permission in Principle to major housing-led development so landowners and developers now have a fast route to secure the principle of development for housing on sites without having to work up detailed plans first. I would urge you to take a look at the proposals at the following link:

Members have all been receiving our digital copy of News and Views with information about talks the federation have set up via Zoom which we can sign into. Continued......





OVER 1,000 VISITORS TO THE ROMAN VILLA MOSAICS IN 2020

The North Leigh Roman Villa Volunteers were established last summer, to work with English Heritage to improve access to the 3rd century AD mosaics housed at the Villa. So it is very heartening to report that the third and final Open Weekend of a Covid-truncated summer season saw the 1,000th visitor to the mosaics this year. The weather over the weekend of September 12th & 13th was beautiful, as it had been for the two previous open weekends in August. Families with children were much in evidence, exploring the Roman remains and picnicking in the sunshine.

Everything was organised in a safe socially-distanced fashion, with valuable professional input from English Heritage, indeed one visitor remarked: "This is one of the most safe and well thought out set of procedures I have met since this virus situation began so have every confidence all will go well. Thank you for your hard work on this."

There was a first at September's open days, as Mary Luckhurst of English Heritage led volunteers, some fortunate Friends of North Leigh Roman Villa, and even a few visiting children, in a thorough cleaning of the mosaics with badger-hair brushes, dabbing with de-ionised water on cotton wool and an awful lot of kneeling. This was probably the first "deep clean" of the mosaics in over a decade. Perhaps the timing is appropriate!

These are the finest Roman mosaics in Oxfordshire still in their original location and were last regularly open to visitors about 30 years ago. Clearly this initiative has been appreciated, as visitor donations at these free events have topped £700 in 2020. Thank you.

The site is entirely free and large enough for safe social distancing during any visit. It is a pleasant walk from the village to the villa, so please consider leaving your car at home.



FARMING WITH NATURE - Farm Diary - August 2020

Early August sees temperatures well into the 30's. Perfect weather to cut and bale the wildflower meadows and, despite the shortage of straw this year, my neighbour kindly sets aside 80 acres of wheat straw for our cattle's winter bedding.

August 31st records one of the lowest temperatures for an August Bank holiday. The air is cool, autumnal and the early morning is wonderfully quiet – no traffic noise at all.

This is my first opportunity to assess the damage the recent strong winds have left behind. Huge limbs have been torn from mature oaks, heavy with the weight of wet leaves and acorns. The withering leaves release a pungent aroma that fills the air. Several large willows have been ripped apart and lay strewn, as if hit by an explosion... it will keep us busy this winter (clearing up) but, the log shed will be full!

The spring oats were not quite fit (ripe) when the weather broke and have now lost their golden colour to a rain stained grey. I fear their milling potential will have also been lost but, they are still standing and will be harvested at the first opportunity of dry weather.

I am drawn to the sound of multiple bird song; flocks of linnet descend from the hedges to feed in the standing crop.

One of life's simple pleasures is the picking and eating of field mushrooms. The heavy rain has triggered the emergence of a multitude of different fungi. It is particularly pleasing to pick my first field mushrooms from the middle of our large field named "Lancashire" (if anyone with local knowledge knows the origin of the name, I would be most interested). Upon taking on the tenancy, I reinstated the fields to their pre-intensive arable status of pasture. Each year has seen the pastures improve and with the help of the cows (some 12 years on) conditions are favourable for mushrooms.

Walking down hill in the direction of Eynsham, I climb over the wooden gate that takes me from my own land to City Farm. Ten years ago, I began the management of this unique 250-acre farm.

Entered into a Higher-Level Stewardship scheme, the main objective has been to lightly manage a mosaic of arable and pasture, encouraging and enhancing flora and fauna...it has been a great success. City Farm has never been farmed intensively, resulting in a time capsule of a bygone rural era. Ten years have passed quickly; I feel fortunate to have been custodian of what I call 'West Oxfordshire's last piece of rainforest'. As the yellow planning notices display the inexorable progression towards the Garden Village development (which will adversely affect City Farm) I reflect on the countless hours spent at Public meetings in an attempt to highlight the ecological value of this entire area.

It will be interesting to see if both promoter and District Council stick to their stated objectives of a net ecological gain for the Garden Village...time will tell.

Meanwhile, September and Autumn beckon.

HANBOROUGH & FREELAND RUNNING GROUP

Hanborough Freeland Running Group is a new endeavour, which started just this July. We are hoping to grow and develop the group as a community for local runners. If you tend to run by yourself (or in a small group) but would be interested in finding some local runners to go for a run with, whether for a social run or to do some more focused training, then this could be for you.



The running groups are peer led - essentially like minded runners meet up and head off to run together.

Group members have an extensive knowledge of local roads and footpaths so there is plenty of opportunity to experience some new routes, or to share some of your favourite routes with others. There are also a number of local runners with extensive experience so there might also the opportunity to pick up on some new ideas for your runs or training.

Presently we have a weekly evening run each Wednesday and we are looking at some other options including during the daytime which may suit some schedules better.

The groups cover a wide range of abilities and experiences; from those looking to start running or wanting to run more regularly, through to seasoned club runners and former competitive runners who have focused race goals as well as pretty much every other running ability in between.

We hope that over time the number of people involved will increase to create plenty of opportunities to run with other local runners of similar interest and ability.

It is early days for the group, and so the current format is for a regular weekly evening run. Depending on who attends, we split off into groups based on ability and go for a run. Runners take it in turns to come up with different routes. Currently, we run for 30-50 minutes, but we are keen to arrange for other opportunities for anyone who does not feel that they can presently run at that level, or, if there is demand, for longer distance runs. The more runners who come along, the more sub-groups we can split into.

To comply with current English Athletics and Public Health England guidelines, we make sure we stay at a good 2m distance apart and limit our group sizes to a maximum of 6 people per group. This actually works out well, because then folk can ask each other about their pace and choose to run together accordingly.

The current weeknight social run takes place on a **Wednesday**, meeting at field outside the Hanborough Pavilion, near the car park, for a **6.30pm** departure. Please come ready to run and look out for runners.

By the time you read this we expect that a daytime run may also be established. A local runner has kindly volunteered to help put something together and has had positive interest already. We expect that this might become a popular alternative for those who have other commitments during the evening, or others who want to make the most of the children being at school.

We would like to be able to offer more group opportunities, including for a "couch to 5K" group, or similar. Because the groups are peer led, any volunteers to help out with coordinating such a group would be welcomed. We think that such a group would be very popular.

There is also some interest to create some training groups for those who race, with a number of local route options which we know which are great for such training.

Many of you will also run (or wish to continue running) through the dark winter months. The groups group intends to stay active as the autumn and winter approaches, including running in the dark if you want to join night-time runs.

If you've not come across Strava before, it's a website where runners can register (for free - no need to subscribe to or pay for anything) and post messages about runs they do or plan to do. (Strava does have other features but you don't have to use any of them if you don't want to.)


