Dear Friends,

I don't know about you, but I know that many of us are feeling pretty fed up of living with COVID-19 in our midst. Some of us are tired, frustrated, fed-up and weary. Some of us are angry - and others are grieving - grieving the loss of loved ones, grieving the way things used to be, grieving a myriad of other losses.

One of my favourite Bible stories is one about Elijah - he's feeling like the last righteous person on earth. He feels so awful that he says to God 'God, I'm so angry! I want to die!' And God says: 'Here's some food, why don't you have a nap?' So Elijah slept and ate, and slept and ate, and rehydrated, and decided things weren't so bad, and then spent 40 days on Horeb, the mount of God (Never underestimate the spiritual power of a snack and a nap).

When it feels like you're the only one left, when you're tired and hungry, When we want to say, like Elijah 'It is enough now, O Lord - I can't go on.' God comes to us and says 'Take heart. It is I. Do not be afraid.'

Time and time again in the bible, when people are feeling at their most human, God shows up. Same story: different places, different ways. God provides bread for our hunger, healing for our sickness, reassurance for our anxiety, comfort for our fear, God brings us snacks and naps and hot baths and tells us to take time out, and just be with God.

God says to us: Take heart. It is I. Do not be afraid.

May God's comfort and loving presence be with you, now and always.

### FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL - LISA'S NOTES FROM THE JULY 2020 MEETING

### Speeding/traffic issues

Two residents were in attendance at the July meeting to raise concerns about speeding traffic in Freeland and what could be done about it. Sadly this is an ongoing issue, and not one that is solved easily. However, it was agreed that the Parish Council would fund a traffic monitoring system at 3 different points in the village as a starting point to survey the amount of traffic coming through the village. It is not clear when this will be done but it should be done shortly.

#### **Parish Council meeting**

Just a brief reminder that there is no Parish Council meeting in August, so our next 'virtual' meeting will be on **Monday 21**<sup>st</sup> **September**. ### Play equipment on playing field

The play areas on the field are being well used but can I please remind everyone about the safe usage of the equipment. Many people are choosing to ignore the limits set on the numbers of children allowed per item of equipment, and are not adhering to social distancing. These regulations are there to keep everyone safe, so please abide by them! The hand sanitizer is running out regularly (which is good as it shows it is being used), and we are checking this weekly, but please do also bring some along yourselves as I cannot always guarantee it will have been refilled in time for your visit!

Freeland Parish Council reminds parents that allowing children to use the playground equipment is done at their own risk where appropriate.

### Coronavirus - an update

As mentioned last month, the volunteer prescription service will cease at the end of August. This means that the central phone line **01993 651330** will no longer operate from the **31**st **August**.



The mosaic house of North Leigh Roman Villa will be open for the final time this year: I I am to 4:30pm, Saturday I2th and Sunday I3th September.

Our first opening in August attracted over 300 visitors, in a safe socially-distanced fashion, under blue skies and a hot summer sun.

Safety is a paramount concern, face masks must be worn inside the mosaic house. Free timed tickets for the mosaics are only issued on site, on the day. There was no crowding on our first August weekend, but if you would prefer a quieter time consider 1.30pm – 2.30pm on Saturday.

These are the finest Roman mosaics in Oxfordshire still in their original location and were last regularly open to visitors about 30 years ago. A new team of local volunteers, working with English Heritage who run the site, are making it possible to enjoy the 3<sup>rd</sup> century AD mosaics once more.

The Eynsham Medical Group are working hard to reintroduce services that were previously suspended to due to Covid 19 restrictions. # FARMING WITH NATURE - Farm Diary - July 2020

With the exception of the last day of the month, when the temperature briefly hit 35.5degrees, July has seen the return to normal, English, summer weather. A good rain once a week, pleasant temperatures and intermittent cloudy skies, have restored the parched pastures to lush green.

July is traditionally the month for making hay. Most of the wildflowers have set seed and ground nesting birds have reared their first clutch of chicks. Young deer (fawns) and young hare (leverets) no longer sit tight and fall prey to the mower; but move at the first close encounter. Nevertheless, as the pastures are a seething mass of life, great care is needed.

The mower is set to leave sufficient stubble, allowing the blades to pass over the 'runs' of small mammals. As the grass lays down behind the mower, a multitude of tiny frogs and grasshoppers adjust to their changed habitat. For those creatures not small enough to pass under or over the mower blades, their fate is down to the vigilance of the tractor driver. Speed is of the essence; but mowing is a job that needs to be done slowly.

Regular halts are needed to allow the occupants of the meadow to move to safety. A hen pheasant follows her instinct and leads her chicks away from the passing mower but, into the remaining standing grass. As she finally pops out, ten chicks follow...my eyes genuinely ache after several hours of peering into the crop for signs of wildlife. I leave islands of uncut grass, picking out patches of late flowering bird's-foot trefoil, clover, wild carrot or devil's-bit scabious. This allows the pollinating insects an oasis, whilst giving cover to hares and young chicks.

A buzzard, a pair of kites and a lone kestrel position themselves at strategic points around the field...looking for a meal.

Once cut, the grass is left to wilt for a day before spreading it out (tedding) to allow the sun and wind to dry it from grass to hay, the sweet aromatic smell is a delight and, in winter, when the bales are opened, it is an evocative reminder of summer.

A large, male fox saunters along the hedgerow, stopping to delicately pick blackberries. The cows reach over the electric fence with their long tongues, to feed on crab apples and sloes (which are in abundance this year)

Organic farming creates tantalising habitat for wildlife...Modern machinery, however, continues to become bigger and faster, removing or disturbing habitat in the blink of an eye so, field margins, large hedgerows and unharvested areas are essential, to keep the balance. Many of our boundary hedges are ten feet tall and at least as wide.

The spring oats are ripening, and the cows are milking well. Their calves tuck into the garlic licks, which are intended to make the cattle less appealing to flies. I am not convinced it works, but the cattle enjoy the taste!

Brian, the lame bull, has been out of action for five weeks but, is clearly feeling better. The introduction of six maiden heifers (young cows yet to bear their first calf) attracts his attention.

At this moment in time, all is well on the farm as August beckons.


