

Letter from our Associate Rector, Rev. Mike Madden:

Dear friends.

"When I pray, coincidences happen. When I don't, they don't." Archbishop William Temple

A few years ago, I was working in Seoul in South Korea when I had the opportunity to visit a prayer retreat centre called Prayer Mountain, which was run by one of the large churches there. The Prayer Mountain campus was close to the border between South and North Korea. In fact, after a short drive, one could see the border with its lines of barbed wire separating the two Koreas, which was quite a sobering experience.

In truth, I think I was more a tourist than a pilgrim, only staying at Prayer Mountain for a day. Whereas many so called 'normal' South Korean Christians would come to pray for anything from a couple of days to forty days, often fasting as well as praying. While these apparently very ordinary, yet quite extraordinary believers prayed for a variety of things including personal needs for themselves, family, friends, neighbours, and colleagues, they prayed most often and most passionately for their nation. As I wandered around the Prayer Mountain campus with my interpreter, we heard people crying out to God for their nation, particularly praying for peace on the Korean Peninsula.

Just hearing those cries echoing around the complex was incredibly moving, but what really surprised me was when my interpreter informed me that a section of the evening prayer meeting in the main auditorium would be given over to praying for the UK. Here I was 5,500 miles away from home amid a group of Christians who were praying passionately for the UK. It was humbling, challenging, and inspiring that these believers, many of whom would never step foot in the UK, were praying for my nation.

So why I am telling this story, well the Bible encourages all believers to pray for our nations.

- In I Timothy 2:1-2 it says, "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."
- And then in 2 Chronicles 7:14 it says, "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

Quite simply, God has always called his people to pray for their nation, just as he is calling us as his people in this generation to pray for our nation today. My encouragement then is to pray for our villages, our towns, and our nation. So that, in the wise words of Archbishop William Temple, coincidences happen!





Green Tip

It seems that every month a new record is broken when it comes to the climate crisis. September has just been declared as globally the hottest month on record, and not by a small margin! Now we are experiencing an unseasonably warm mid-October in the south of England, whilst Scotland experiences unseasonably heavy rain and flooding.

With the continuing climate crisis, we need to remember that as individuals we do have agency, we can make a difference. Previously we have focused on how simple changes to our purchase and consumption of food can reduce our carbon footprint substantially. This month we will turn our attention to the clothes we wear. It is not generally known that our apparel has a significant carbon footprint, for example a pair of cotton jeans has roughly the same carbon impact (approx. 80kg CO2 eq) as driving a petrol or diesel car 200 miles, whilst an eyewatering quantity of water is used in the manufacture (12,000 litres). In the UK we purchase more clothes per person than any other country in Europe, 75% of which end up in landfill. By reducing the number of new clothes we buy we can significantly reduce the damage our lifestyle does on the planet, whilst at the same time saving money. There are several ways to do this. We can wear clothes for longer and repair them when necessary. When we need additional clothes buying second-hand is a great option as it reduces the pollution associated with making new. There are several apps available such as Vinted and eBay where you can buy pre-loved clothes. We are also very lucky in that Eynsham and Witney both have a great selection of charity shops selling pre-loved clothes. Buying from charity shops has multiple advantages; it reduces pollution, saves money for the consumer, and provides support for a good cause. It has recently been stated that enough clothes have been manufactured to furnish the next six generations. For the sake of the planet, we need to think about moderating the demand for new clothes.



THERMAL IMAGING

As the work required to assess the thermal properties of our homes is not difficult, we can easily train additional volunteers who might want to join us in mapping the village. We will carry out the imaging on a first come first served basis and will endeavour to meet every request but as this exercise is very much dependant on the weather this may not be possible.

FREELAND SPEEDWATCH

During the last year 71 sessions have been held during which 5228 vehicles have been monitored at various locations in the village. 512 of these were reported to Thames Valley Police. This means that almost 10% of vehicles were travelling at excessive speeds. At one location the number of offenders was over 19% and the highest recorded speeds were 66mph and 70mph!




