Letter from our Curate:

Dear Friends.

This is the first time I have had the privilege of writing for the Grapevine in my relatively new role as Assistant Curate in the parishes of Hanborough and Freeland. Therefore I thought I would start by briefly introducing myself. I am married with three grown up sons and one granddaughter. As a self-supporting minister, I also run my own consultancy business, which serves the energy industry mainly in the developing world,

Like most of us during this COVID-19 crisis I am 'staying at home, in order to protect the NHS, and save lives'. In the midst of these sometimes scary and sober times I have found myself spending more time in our garden enjoying its quiet peace in the absence of airplane and traffic noise. While I have used these times to pray for our family, friends, the Benefice and the nation, I have also found myself simply enjoying creation looking at the trees with all their different colours and listening to the numerous birds singing in and around our garden.

During these times of quiet, as I have enjoyed the simplicity of creation, I have found God quietly breaking into my thoughts often sparked by looking at a tree, or a flower, bringing peace, insight and sometimes wisdom. We see this pattern of God breaking into the hearts and minds of men and women by speaking through creation throughout the Bible. For example, God used everyday items such as plum lines (Amos 7:7) and bowls of ripe fruit (Amos 8:1) to catch the attention of Amos the prophet before giving him a message for his nation. While most of us are unlikely to be given messages for our nation, these times of quiet in our garden have reminded me, that God wants to speak to all of us more than we realise, often speaking through the beauty and simplicity of creation.

So next time you find yourself enjoying a quiet moment in the midst of God's creation, listen for the whispered question from God "What do you see?". You might be surprised what God says.



Wishing all of our members and the community a safe and healthy time through this difficult period!

Ironically, with the recent good weather, the pitch, having been a lake for the last 4 months, is now playable. Unfortunately all Leagues have been cancelled and voided! We have now managed to have the field verti-drained which involves a tractor spiking down 10 inches to help with the drainage. So with no games being played, hopefully the rest and a bit of TLC will stand the pitch in good stead for next season.

I have asked Club Captain, Dr Conor Almond, to look back at a few previous games for this month's report... Stay safe from everyone at Freeland FC.

As I sit here writing this in isolation, I have cast my mind over some of the highs and lows of playing for Freeland after the past few years. One low that sticks in my mind, was a sunny day down Jordan Hill against the former greats of the Oxford Senior League, Oxford University Press. After a near perfect 85 minute performance, with Freeland winning 3-0, it was time for the entrance of veteran defender Sam Symonds. In the 5 minutes that followed, Symonds was able to lose 3 back post headers to the smallest player on the pitch (4ft 7inches – with studs) with the game ending 3-3. With the telling off that ensued from the former great and then manager Simon Hole, Symonds playing days were all but over, as were his linesman duties – after a poorly timed text against Heyford Athletic (6 yards offside) led to a clearly offside goal, which all but ended the First Team League chances for the 2018-19 season.

As I'm sure all in the village and associated with the Club would agree, one great day in the Freeland red, would have to be the Charity Cup Final against the old foe Hanborough FC. In a packed out Court Place Farm holding 3468 on the day, Freeland romped to victory with an all but comfortable 3-1 final result. Sitting here reminiscing about past memorable moments, I look forward to many more to come, in the future.

North Leigh History Society started in September 2004. Since then we have had some changes and we've moved from the Memorial Hall to the Turner Hall in Church Road, but we have always maintained a high standard of talks and we have a faithful following. Over the years we've had a variety of speakers and we've ventured into musical events once or twice with the Oxford Waits and a shanty group, Short Drag Roger. We've celebrated Christmas and Easter in the style of the Tudors and of the 17th century, and Tim Healey took us through the myths and stories around the Green Man. We've explored the history of Roman Villas, Blenheim Palace, Anglo-Saxon farms, the workhouse, Ditchley Park and Oxfordshire schools. John Woolley took us through the steady police work that tracked down the men who plotted and carried out the Great Train Robbery, and Dr Peter Kirby dazzled us with the exciting development of nuclear physics at Culham laboratory. In 2014, the anniversary of the First World War we mounted an exhibition in North Leigh Memorial Hall which attracted a great deal of attention and we contributed to an earlier exhibition about all the groups in the village.

We are very grateful to all those who have given talks for us and who have been enormously knowledgeable and well prepared. A few names have been mentioned above but there are many people who have contributed and made our group a success. Thank you everyone who has come to our group as a member or a visitor. Your enthusiasm and commitment has made it all worthwhile.

We are really sorry we were unable to complete this year's programme and have had to cancel the last two talks, 600 years of Morris Dancing and The Romanovs. Hopefully we will be able to re-book them for another time.



COVID-19 MEDICAL UPDATES

All arrangements concerning how to contact the Eynsham Medical Group (Long Hanborough or Eynsham surgeries) with a medical problem remain unaltered since the Notice previously posted. Equally, existing appointments with a nurse are currently continuing as before. Pharmacy/Dispensary services remain open as usual but please note that **7 calendar days** are now required for repeat prescriptions as requests are currently 300% higher than normal.

For more urgent prescriptions, these will be dealt with as appropriate. For those sending repeat prescriptions online through EMIS, there is a box in which special requests can be made.

Social Distancing arrangements are in place for entry into both surgeries. Do, please, be aware that any of these arrangements may change if circumstances within the Practice alter.

Eye care

Eye doctors at Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust are urging people to take extra care of their eyes as more people carry out DIY and household tasks while in lockdown. The Oxford Eye Hospital, based at the John Radcliffe Hospital, has seen an increase in the number of patients needing care for serious eye injuries.

People are encouraged to take extra care, particularly when gardening or carrying out DIY, by wearing eye protection when necessary, and locking up household detergents and chemicals away from children as they can cause nasty chemical burns - particularly to the delicate eye area.

Wearing glasses instead of contact lenses will also protect the eyes and reduce the chance of spreading COVID-19.

Stella Hornby, Clinical Lead for Ophthalmology and Consultant Ophthalmologist at the Trust, said: "We're seeing patients with more serious eye injuries and people have needed operations to repair injuries which could potentially result in sight loss". "We think this is because people are locked down and they might be doing more DIY or gardening at home without using eye protection."

"Wearing glasses instead of contact lenses at the moment reduces the risk of contact lens-related complications, and reduces the need to touch your face." National guidance states that people should avoid touching their face, in particular their eyes, nose, and mouth to avoid spreading the COVID-19 virus.

If patients have urgent eye problems, they should **call the telephone triage number** (see below) instead of attending our Emergency Departments.

You will be able to speak to an ophthalmic health professional who will advise you. If you need advice **out of hours**, please phone **NHS III** or your out of hours GP practice.

If you have an **eye trauma**, **chemical splash** or **severe eye pain** out of hours, please go straight to the John Radcliffe Hospital **Emergency Department (A&E)**.

FREELAND CRICKET CLUB

We were due to start outdoor training during the first week of April and our first matches were due to start at the end of April, but these have all been suspended due to the current Covid-19 pandemic. FREELAND RESIDENTS LOCKED DOWN IN WAIHEKE ISLAND

It is 16/04/2020, day 21 of lockdown here in on Waiheke Island, New Zealand. Although it is disconcerting not being in our home in Freeland there are worse places to be during these troubled times than here on Waiheke Island, New Zealand. It's warm, it's sunny. Up until the government issued new restrictions, we were able to swim, cycle and walk freely around this lovely island. At the time of writing, NZ has had 1386 cases of Covid-19 and and 9 related deaths , 7 of those in one of 2 care homes. These low numbers, we feel, is testament to the brilliant leadership of Jacinda Ardern, the Prime Minister, and her teams including opposition MPs.

Being close neighbours of China, the PM quickly closed the borders with China and other affected countries. NZ also went into tight lockdown quicker than most other countries. Jacinda and her team have spoken in simple language and created the concept of our own bubble of people repeating on TV every night "Stay home. Don't have contact with anyone outside your household "bubble." Be kind. We're all in this together."and it's worked as so far as the population are sticking to the rules and the virus is pretty well contained.

We see on TV, how around the world, sports arenas are being turned into hospital wards to take the sick. Auckland's biggest arena has been turned into a food distribution centre where volunteers are making up cartons of food to be taken out to the homes of the poor. You have to love this lady. But then its much easier to manage a population of 4.6 million than the 67 million that make up the UK.

So, not such a bad place to be in these troubled times, not that we had a choice as our flight out of NZ for mid-April has been cancelled and we don't qualify for a mercy flight. We are destined to stay here for the foreseeable future and to experience a New Zealand Winter which at times can be harsh given our proximity to the Antarctic. As we come out of lockdown, discussion is focused on the economy. The agricultural sector is the largest industry in the country and will survive, and probably thrive, as long as China wants to drink milk and eat meat. Tourism on the other hand will take a huge hit along with all the small businesses that depend upon visitors to New Zealand.

We felt inspired to write this correspondence from abroad in order to say a big 'Thank You' to all of you who contribute articles and reports to help make the Grapevine happen. Being on the other side of the world, a highlight of the week is listening to 'The Archers Omnibus' and each month we anticipate the email telling us that the latest Grapevine is online on the Freeland Village website **www.freelandoxon.co.uk**It's a brilliant way to keep up to date with village happenings. Especially enjoyable is the

recent new inclusion of Robert Crocker's Farm Diary. It helps us to appreciate why, even though we love coming to this beautiful country to see our NZ family, ultimately Freeland will always be our home.

Finally a promotion for 'Unexpected Tales' an anthology of short stories written by 17 local authors. We brought the 3 volumes with us to NZ and we have read them all – astonishing, they are brilliant - so please get going with the 2020 edition - see **page 19**.

The Mill is of course currently closed to visitors but this gives the opportunity to explain what goes on during normal weeks. The Mill is open to the public on Wednesdays and the first Sunday of the month, between March and October. On the third Sunday of the month, the Mill is open and in steam, which means visitors can see all of our machinery in full working order as well as enjoying the hospitality on offer. FARMING WITH NATURE - Farm Diary - March 2020

The first calf arrived on March 8th. By March 28th, we have 30.

Despite having witnessed countless calves born over the years...it never fails to move me. The first intake of breath and a shake of the head confirms this calf is going to be fine.

The mum wastes no time in licking her new calf clean with her rasping tongue and, in doing so, stimulates the calf's breathing and circulation. Within minutes of a normal delivery, the calf staggers to its feet, instinctively searching for milk. (The first milk, colostrum, is rich in antibodies)

These docile, domesticated animals are returned to the wild with a rush of hormones which gives the cow the aggression to see off any predator...it is for this reason that cows with calves need the utmost respect. Once the calf has suckled, the cow's mood relaxes a little but, she is constantly alert and defensive. To a cow with calf a dog, however small or friendly, is a wolf...a potential threat.

Within an hour or so, the calf is ready to follow its mother. The calves soon become playful and, as the cows tuck into their sainfoin hay, the calves' race around the straw yard.

Clouds of blackthorn flowers in the hedgerows, gleam pure white against a dark sky and everywhere there is the frantic activity of birds. The dawn chorus is a delight; the Wren is first to rise with a diminutive call signalling, to the Blackbird and countless Great Tits, that it is time to sing. In a matter of minutes, the air is ringing with a symphony of bird song lead by a sole Song Thrush perched on the highest branch of a cherry tree...its song is complex with several verses, which he repeats. The Song Thrush, a once common sight and sound in gardens and fields across the country has had its numbers decimated, mostly by the use of slug pellets, removing its food source of snails.

A week of cold March winds are drying the waterlogged fields, allowing ploughing to commence. The furrows roll over, releasing the evocative smell of fresh soil. A pair of Red Kites immediately appear to feed on the exposed worms. These magnificent birds perch on the furrow and are indifferent to the passing tractor. Wagtails join at a respectful distance and flocks of Linnet alight as the tractor approaches.

A pair of hares appear from nowhere and display their powerful back legs as they accelerate across the field. Three Roe deer push through the hedge to see who is intruding upon their territory...they turn, showing their white derrieres before bounding off in to the distance. What a magical time of year, what an enchanting place. The plough moves slowly across the fields towards Eynsham, turning the landscape from beige to brown. The last two decades of sensitive farming has seen our Skylark population multiply year by year. There are now too many to count and their song fills the air. With the planned housing development imminent I already look at these fields with a sense of nostalgia.

April beckons...will the cuckoo return?


