Letter from our Curate, Rev. Mike Madden:

Dear friends,

This month I want to briefly explore how incredible it is that as Christians, as sons and daughters of the living God, we have immediate unhindered access to God the Father because of the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, through a simple but true personal story.

A few years ago, when our children were still at home, I used to work in London, in a typically secure office with security guards, scanners, and swipe cards etc. One day a group of colleagues came to our London office from Asia to ask for our help on a particular project. They had a long journey involving cars, trains, planes, letters of recommendation and visas. Even after arriving in London, they still had to pass through our strict office security.

So, finally after all this travelling, the team from Asia were in the middle of making a pitch for our help when suddenly, my phone rang. I could see it was my eldest son ringing. Now this was very unusual since neither my wife nor any of our children would ring me at work unless it was important. So, when the phone rang, and I saw it was my son calling, I didn't hesitate to answer it. I stopped the meeting saying, "I am really sorry, this is an important call that I need to take it." I stepped out the meeting and answered the phone, fearing a domestic calamity, when my eldest son said, "Dad tickets for the European cup semi-finals are on sale, can I have your credit card details?" At which point, after breathing a sigh of relief, I surreptitiously got my credit card out and gave my son the relevant details.

In this story, we can catch a glimpse of the difference between simply being a petitioner like my colleagues from Asia who went to great lengths to ask for help and being a son. My son because of his relationship with me, had direct access to me and all my resources immediately with no barriers. There was never any doubt in his mind (at least) that I both had the resources, and that he could access them. Quite simply he knew this because he was my son.

As Christians, as sons and daughters of the living God, we too have direct and immediate access to our heavenly father, which Paul highlights in his letter to the Ephesians as follows.

¹⁷ Christ came and preached the Good News of peace to all - to you Gentiles, who were far away from God, and to the Jews, who were near to him. ¹⁸ It is through Christ that all of us, Jews and Gentiles, are able to come in the one Spirit into the presence of the Father. (Ephesians 2:17-18)

Therefore, my prayer this month is that each of us would grow in our understanding of, and relationship with God the Father, taking advantage of the gift of access to God the Father that Jesus paid such a high price for.



At our June meeting we were delighted to welcome David, who told us all about the work of the Thames Valley Air Ambulance. Thames Valley Air Ambulance is a charity that brings hospital level care by land and air.

Their purpose is to give everyone within our community the best chance of surviving and recovering from an emergency, by providing critical care at the scene and beyond.

The Air Ambulance first took to the skies in 1999. They operate



365 days a year and can be anywhere in Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire within 15 minutes. They are an independent charity and receive no government or national lottery funding relying solely on donations from supporters. The Thames Valley Air Ambulance helicopter is based at RAF Benson with two pilots and a medical team. It also operates five emergency response vehicles which like the helicopter come with a doctor and paramedic.

Last year they were called out 2880 times to help people in need of urgent care. Each call out mission costs £3900.

Freeland WI normally meet on the second Monday of the month in the Village Hall, starting at **7.45pm** and finishing around **10pm**. Our meetings usually consist of an activity or speaker, a raffle and refreshments. We always look forward to welcoming visitors and new members at our meetings. Last month's speaker was Mary Fenton who spoke of 'The Wonder of Trees'. She mentioned many amazing facts about trees such as the age of some monsters, the wildlife they support and the many uses of their wood. She had many pictures to support her talk.

The speaker on **Monday 27th June at 7.30pm** in Freeland Hall is Dominic Hamilton telling us about the Rococo Garden at Painswick. This is a very unusual garden, following the 18th century ornate style of gardening popular in Europe at that time. Painswick is a place that can be an easy day trip out. He will no doubt try to tempt us to visit!

The Club has a change of speaker for **Monday 25th July** to the one advertised. Avril Hughes has stepped in with a talk titled 'Views, Vistas and Visits'. Her photos may give us ideas of places well worth seeing. Her talk is in Freeland Hall at **7.30pm**. There will be a Plant and Gardening Items sale as well. Due to the lower number of Gardening Club members as before lockdown, the Club has had to make a few changes to improve our finances. We always try to find good speakers of interesting subjects and their fees have increased considerably. Tea and Coffee and biscuit will now cost £1 and subs will be increased after the AGM in October.

Some jobs to be done in July are: start picking soft fruit as it ripens, usually starting with Gooseberries. You can cut off the branches with blackcurrant berries on and pick off the fruit while sitting in a chair. This prunes the bush at the same time and saves bending down under the bush!! Don't cut off all the fruiting branches. Some fruit may need protecting as birds also enjoy what we have grown. Hoe regularly to remove weeds. Lawn mowing and edge trimming has been a constant task due to the recent rain. If we come in for a dry spell later in the year, use all kitchen water to water vegetables and plants. Install waterbuts to fill them when it is raining, saving the use of tap water. Deadhead annuals to prolong their flowering time.

In the vegetable garden also pick when they are ready. Don't let broad beans get too big as they are much nicer when young and tender. Pick courgettes also when smaller. Leave sweetcorn till the tassels have gone brown and, on opening a cob a little, the corn inside looks yellow and ripe. Sow successions of a few lettuce seeds at a time, so as not to have too many ready at once.

These are just a few suggestions!

The Committee are in the process of deciding what to do for our Social Meeting on **22nd August.**

INSPECTOR RESPONDS TO AREA ACTION PLAN FOR SALT CROSS GARDEN VILLAGE

The Planning Inspector has responded to West Oxfordshire District Council on the Area Action Plan (AAP) for Salt Cross Garden Village, paving the way for the plan to be approved and setting the scene for the development to progress.

The Area Action Plan sets out the framework for how the Salt Cross Garden Village should be a landscape led development, taking into account key factors such as affordable housing, protecting the environment, active travel and business growth.

The AAP was developed through extensive consultation with local communities to make sure the development is right for the district.

The plan includes:

- A requirement to deliver 25% biodiversity net gain compared to a national standard of at least 10%
- A mix of new homes including opportunities for self-build and 50% affordable housing, including a mixture of rented and affordable home ownership options
- A new 40ha science and technology park adjacent to a 'park and ride' into Oxford
- Around 50% (including private gardens and green roofs) of the area will form an accessible and high quality green infrastructure network
- A comprehensive green infrastructure network for walking and cycling to reduce the need for reliance on cars
- A plan to ensure that local people are able to benefit from training and local job opportunities

The Council submitted the AAP for Salt Cross in February 2021 with the Planning Inspector holding public hearings to obtain resident, developer and business views on the plans.

The Inspector has now confirmed the plan is close to completion subject to changes set out in their letter. The council will now consult on those changes proposed by the Inspector.

The Inspector has approved most of the council's ambitious plans including ground breaking targets for biodiversity and for affordable housing but did not approve the requirement for new homes to be built to net-zero carbon standards.

Councillor Carl Rylett, Cabinet Member for Planning and Sustainable Development, said, "We are very disappointed the Inspector did not approve the net zero carbon homes approach we proposed. However, the Council is absolutely committed to doing whatever it can to tackle the Climate Change Emergency, and we will be looking at what other options are available to us to minimise any ongoing impact to the climate."

Views will be sought on the proposed changes through a full public consultation – the timing of which will be confirmed as soon as possible, but is anticipated to take place from **July 2022 for a period of 6 weeks**.



FREELAND JUBILEE PICNIC CAKE STALL

The Freeland-Ukraine Support Group responded to the Parish Council's offer to run a cake stall with great enthusiasm. Many hosts have been enjoying Ukrainian baking from their guests – often using a version of cottage cheese and sour cream as key ingredients. This seemed a good opportunity for the Ukrainians who were happy to bake to give something back to the community, and at the same time to raise some funds for the support group's future initiatives. The hope was that with a reasonable turn-out it might be feasible to sell up to 100 slices of cakes and a few whole cakes as well as some cookies and biscuits. The group purchased 100 paper plates and paper bags and some cake boxes to accommodate this goal.

The Community rallied around to add to the Ukrainian offerings with their own biscuits, tray bakes and cakes. Then on the day before the picnic there was concern that the weather forecast would mean that we would have more goodies than customers to purchase them!

In addition to selling slices to eat on the day, a couple of our Ukrainian guests offered to bake Ukrainian cakes to be raffled as prizes.

The weather was much kinder than that forecast for Sunday 5th, and by the end of the afternoon Doreen, Rosie, Fiona, and Chris (the Nash Lane Crew) were able to surface for air, having been inundated by supportive cake and cookie munchers. Within an hour the 100 plates had been used up and cakes reserved for sale in their entirety were being sliced to replace those disappearing at speed.

Nearly 300 slices of cake and biscuits were sold at 50p - £1.00, in addition, the sale of whole cakes and the raffle for the Ukrainian creations were well supported. After expenses the afternoon raised an amazing £315.

Big thanks to all of you who supported the cake stall with your baking and purchases! Donations of rhubarb from Julie Stuart-Thompson and the Belz family also contributed over £20 to the returns.

FREELAND COMMUNITY BENEFIT SOCIETY -

Village Hub Project - July 2022

It is now over 5 years since the Methodist Church ceased to be used for worship and a Steering Group conceived of the project to purchase this iconic building for the use of the Community as a Village "social hub", with convenience shop and cafe.

The Steering Group was replaced by a registered limited company, Freeland



Community Benefit Society and since then the Management Committee has worked to prepare to bid to buy the building.

A credible business plan was developed, and this was backed by pledges from Freeland residents and a "fighting fund" of over £5000 has been raised by fund raising events in the Village, donations and grants. WODC has granted permission for change of use of the building as a retail outlet and refused the request from the Methodist Church to develop the site for residential use. However the Methodist Church, in spite of their stated aim of divesting themselves of redundant Churches and of supporting local communities, have not offered the building for sale, or entered into a dialogue with us and it remains empty.

During the last two years, the Covid pandemic has been stressful for everyone and with the on-going lack of progress of the project, several of the FCBS Management Committee have retired. The remaining members have considered whether to terminate the project and dissolve the CBS. However we continue to believe that a community owned and run "hub" would be of great benefit to the Village and the Church is the best location for this and so we have decided to maintain the CBS until such time as we feel that this objective can no longer be achieved. When it is decided to close it down, the options for the distribution of funds to other Village ventures will be addressed.

Shops are only one of the many ventures that communities own and run as social enterprises – these include pubs, recreational facilities, power generation and even community housing. Ukrainian Homes Support Group

HOME FOR UKRAINE SCHEME JUNE UPDATE

Since the last Grapevine we continue to have amazing support for our Ukrainian families.

We now host 30 Ukrainians in 12 Host Families. We are waiting for 4 more guests to arrive to 2 additional hosts.

The latest to arrive have had difficult times in Ukraine spending long periods of the day and nights in bomb shelters as shells explode in hearing distance and missiles fly overhead to other targets. Those still to arrive are being helped out by a Ukrainian lady working at Brookes university.

As guests settle in with their hosts we are moving from the phase of focusing on arrival and immediate needs to the next phase of providing ongoing support.

One need has been for mobility. We have now had donated, by members of the community, bikes for everyone requesting one, and Kenneth Jeddere-Fisher in Freeland and Simon Gundry in Hanborough have been working wonders to get the bikes serviced and ready to go. Meanwhile donations of helmets and the purchase of lights and padlocks together with secondary bike seats for children, (kindly funded by law firm Marks & Clerk LLP), ensure that our guests and their children can ride safely.

The recent mix of fine but windy weather and heavy stormy showers highlighted to all the vulnerability of being a pedestrian or cyclist without waterproof over clothing and waterproof footwear. A request to the community to allow us to supply cagouls, waterproof trousers and welly boots was responded to overnight – and donations of money and excess rainwear and wellies has allowed us now to offer these to all adults and children .

English language tuition has been high on every guests' list. Whilst we run, as a Community, three conversation sessions each week, many of our guests have signed up to formal English lessons in Witney and/or Oxford – often comprising three sessions of two hours across the week.

Sunday afternoon meetings at Christ Church Hall (Hanborough) have recently had over 20 guests, as well as their hosts and members of the Community attending, and have had a buzzing atmosphere. Oxford Food Hub have (following an approach and weekly organisation by Freeland villager Michelle Hunt) supplied a food provision at these meetings - which has been really appreciated. Food is collected on a Thursday or Friday, stored in freezers or chiller boxes and then distributed on a Sunday. Any donations of tins or vegetables, etc. from villagers brought to 20 Nash Lane on a Thursday or Friday would be added to the Sunday offering and would be really welcomed.

When our guests arrived, many of them now over two months ago, they were given a £200 initial payment. For many this has been their only source of income and although all have applied for Universal Credit or have started paid jobs, they are still waiting for their first payment or salary and so the Food Hub, clothing donations, etc. have been life savers during this period. The Thursday 10.30am meetings in St Mary's Church have had fewer numbers (children at school and increasing number of adults working) but are still valued.

Whilst those with some English have been benefiting from formal English lessons in Witney and Oxford, those starting with no English at all have found that the formal lessons have been less useful. Unlike our sessions in the village, there is no interpreter to support them, and they are failing to learn from them in the way hoped. As a result we believe that it will be more valuable to set up a second session each week for these guests in our villages, with a Ukrainian or Russian speaking support teacher. We are now paying for educational resources like flashcards and interactive tools to support these sessions.

Since we started raising funds to support our Ukrainian response we have received financial donations of £3200, and taking into account all that has been spent on the above and the provisions for the four guests still to arrive (and welly boots still to be purchased) we are sitting currently with a surplus of £160 in cash donations. In addition, the Cake Stall at the Jubilee Picnic raised over £300 allowing us to focus on discretionary payments and education support over the summer.

Our next large event. that all of our guests are looking forward to attending, is a trip to Glympton Fayre on **Saturday 25th June**. A benefactor has offered our community a 53 seater coach to and from the event together with a picnic lunch, afternoon tea and all tickets for rides free to the children. This offer is primarily for the Ukrainians but also to any families in the community that wish to take the surplus places on the coach. At present it looks as though there will be as many as 15 places available to villagers.

A further article from Julie Stuart-Thompson on the service personnel listed on the War memorial in St Mary's Church Yard.

Henry was one year old when the 1911 census took place. He was living in Freeland with his parents, aunt and older sister, Dorothy. His father was Alfred Henry aged 28, born in 1883 in Horfield Bristol, a stonemason by trade. His mother was Edith Jane, nee Dix aged 29, born 1882 in Freeland. His aunt, Edith's sister Ruth, aged 26, was an assistant Post Office worker. Alfred and Edith married in 1908 in Witney.

Alfred Henry at age 16, was living in Bristol in 1901 with Emily, his mother and step-father Samuel Weston, Emily and Samuel had married in the summer of 1892 in Bristol. Both Alfred and Samuel are listed as stonemasons

Una Turner was 3 months old at the 1911 census. She was living with her father Richard, a carpenter, b1884 in Radnorshire. Her mother was Katherine Emma nee Keen, b1882 in Barnard Gate. Una (born 4/12/1910), had two older brothers recorded in the census, Wallace aged 5, b1906 in Freeland and the middle child Charles aged 3 b1908 in Hanborough. Una also born in Hanborough. Richard and Kathrine, Una's parents, were married in December 1903 in Witney. We can only assume Richard's family moved for work as in 1891 his family can be found living in the cottage near North Lodge, Hicks Lane, Eynsham. His father was called Alfred Richard b1853 in Worcestershire and is listed as a Huntsman. His wife Caroline was b1848 in Radnor as were the 2 children listed at this time Ellen aged 10 and Richard aged 7.

Henry married Una Turner in 1929 in the Witney registration district. They had four children. Donald b1930, Patricia b1932, Richard b1936 and Diane b1939. From the 1939 register we can see they were living in Freeland at I Blenheim Cottage and Henry a carpenter. Una continued to live in Little Blenheim after Henry's death. She died in 2005 and is buried in St Mary's church yard.

Una's brother Wallace married Olive Dix in early 1937 in Witney.

At an unnamed address on The Green Freeland, Henry's mother Edith Smart (b 5th April 1881), a widow, was living with Dorothy (b August 1908) who was listed as incapacitated and Ernest (b 1 March 1917) a mechanic.

The Commonwealth War Graves site tells us that Henry Thomas Smart 14398705 died on 1st July 1944, son of Alfred Henry and Jane Smart, husband of Una. He was part of the 5th Battalion Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry who fought their way across Northern Europe from the Normandy beaches and died in fighting to reach the area around Caen. He was originally buried in St Vlgor-le-grand but was moved in May 1945 to the Bayeux Cemetery XII E6.

This means that two of the seven men on the St Mary's memorial are resting in the same war cemetery in Normandy, even though they fought for different units and died in different battles.

On his headstone, Henry has the words:

At the going down

Of the sun

And in the morning

We will remember him.




