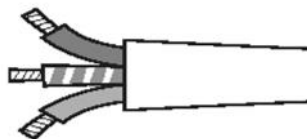
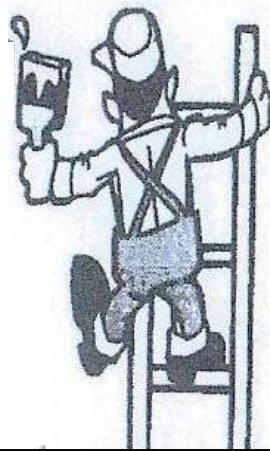
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## The Joy of the Lord is My Strength – Letter from the Curate

I was stomping around the field with my dog on a dull January day, the clouds heavy with pending precipitation which perfectly echoed my mood. I was dragging a weight in my soul, quiet anxiety about situations facing different members of my family and the constant grinding of world news oppressively haunting me with devastating images. And then I heard a glorious chattering song and was immediately struck by the incongruousness of the sound in winter. Usually, you have to squint into the brilliance of a scorched blue sky to catch a glimpse of a sky lark, but today it's tiny fluttering form stood silhouetted against the grey.

I was challenged by the lark's joyful exuberance, the delight in simply *being* all it was made to be that exuded from its chaotic dancing flight. God spoke to me, 'I want you to feel more of my joy, just like that lark'. I felt a release – the weight of the world, like a bag of rocks I'd been dragging behind me, fell to the ground. I remembered again Jesus' words: **'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.'** (Matt 11:28-30)



I wonder what burdens you have been carrying, worries about your family or friends, anxiety about work or health. Maybe like me, you have been feeling the despair of the daily news. But Jesus tells us that his burden is light, we are not expected to shoulder the world's woes, or take responsibility for things we have no power over. Jesus has compassion and love for each and every person he has made and knows

the story of their whole lives. Our part is to ask Jesus to carry the burden of our concerns by giving them back to him in prayer.

I asked myself how I could be more like this lark? He does not worry about what others think of him, he is neither proud nor jealous. He is not attempting to do the work of his creator and is not anxious about the existential threat to his species, (the lark is on the RSPB 'red' list, meaning that its numbers are in decline). The lark may climb as high as 1000 feet, and sing for an hour at a time, putting his heart and soul into being all he was made to be. How could I be more like that? Jesus also said: **'Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?'** (Matt 6:26)

As we place our faith in Jesus, he is able to carry the weight of any burden for us if we hand it to him in prayer and trust him with the final outcome. Then we can invite his inexpressible peace and uncontainable joy to give us strength to face one day at a time.

### **Green tip**

We are all becoming more aware of the sharp decline in the natural world. We can see an example of this when we look at our local rivers. We are a village surrounded by water, and many of us take great pleasure from the Rivers Thames, Evenlode and Windrush. These great rivers are part of our sense of place, but like the rest of nature, rivers are under enormous pressure. We can see the constantly murky state of these rivers and the lack of vegetation in the water.

The reasons that our rivers are in such decline are well documented; effluent pumped untreated into the water as well as the pollution from industrial farming are both culpable. It can feel that, beyond protesting and voting for parties with green policies, we have little agency. But there are some simple lifestyles change we can make that can have a positive impact. I am sure most are aware that wet wipes must never be flushed down the toilet, but we are probably less aware that any chemicals we put down the sink or drain or even spray on the garden will end up in the rivers basically untreated. So, in the garden avoid using chemicals (see Royal Horticultural Society for guidance) and when it comes to the household use natural cleaning products. Many washing-up liquids and detergents contain ingredients that are "harmful to aquatic life, with long lasting effects". Read the label on the back of your washing up liquid. What does it say? Could you switch to a brand that is more eco-friendly? Many beauty personal care products, including perfumes, shampoos, soaps and make-up are frequently laden with chemicals. Consider using more natural products. The natural ones often smell nicer too! By doing our bit reducing the chemicals we use in our day to day life we can help arrest the decline of our beautiful rivers.

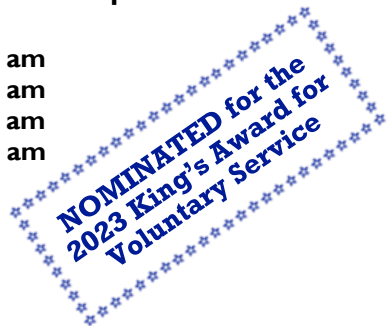

## **FREELAND SPEEDWATCH - VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Could you spare just an hour each week to keep our village roads safe? Our local Speedwatch team has been active for a number of years but is currently in need of more volunteers. Sessions are held at various locations around Freeland, on different days of the week and at different times. Details of vehicles travelling at excessive speeds are then reported to Thames Valley Police who have been supporting our local team by positioning their speed



van in the village on several occasions in the last couple of months. Speeding motorists need to be aware that they are likely to be caught and that could result in being prosecuted, given points on their license or a fine.

But the risk of being caught should not be our main motivation in keeping within the speed limits. It should be the safety of all those who use our roads, especially children and cyclists. Oxfordshire County Council will shortly be conducting a consultation regarding the possible introduction of a 20mph limit in the centre of Freeland. Everyone, no matter what personal views they hold, is encouraged to respond to this but please bear in mind that, according to the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents, 69% of fatal accidents in built up areas involve vehicles travelling at 30mph whereas only 9% of fatalities were at 20mph.

## **FREELAND THERMAL IMAGING PROJECT (FTIP)**

When I came up with the idea of offering the residents of Freeland the opportunity to have the thermal efficiency of their homes checked it was midsummer. If I'd realised how cold it could get and how numb my fingers & feet would be then I might not have gone ahead with it and truth be told, Colin and Paul would probably not have joined me on this venture! However, over the course of January & February we have carried out over 30 visits to properties in Freeland with the thermal imaging camera to assess each property's thermal efficiency. As it was the first time we had done something like this, and we are not thermal engineers, we weren't quite sure what we'd discover. As the old saying goes, the camera doesn't lie, we were pleased to see that apart from a couple of minor issues we discovered all properties we visited appeared to be well insulated and thermally efficient. Based on the conversations we had with some of the householders whilst carrying out this exercise, this was a surprise. Many felt they were paying a lot on their energy bills compared to a friend/neighbour in a similar property. Whilst our imaging exercise could identify heat loss from a home through, for example, poor insulation, it could not measure the property's heat efficiency of the property, that is how well the heating system is working, and this will have a bearing on the size of bills.

With the longer days and warmer weather now (thankfully) coming the imaging project for this winter has concluded but it is our intention to offer this service next winter if there is interest.

### **Thursday 14th March: “Dame Laura Knight” - Rosalind Whyte**

In 1936 Dame Laura Knight became the first woman to be elected as a full member of the Royal Academy in London, 168 years after its establishment. In her extraordinary career she painted landscapes, portraits, and seascapes, as well as scenes from the circus, the ballet, and the theatre. She was the only woman to be given War Commissions in both the First and Second World Wars and the only British artist to cover the Nuremberg Trials in 1946.

This lecture provides an overview of her fascinating career and some of the remarkable achievements of her long life.

### **Thursday 11th April: “The Hay Wain: an in-depth look at a familiar masterpiece” - Timothy Wilcox**

No English painting could be more familiar than Constable's The Hay Wain. But what does it actually represent? What is it about? Painted in 1821 as the third of the series of great six-foot landscapes based on scenes of the Stour Valley on the Suffolk-Essex border, it undoubtedly shows Constable at the very height of his powers. There is much more to it, though, than a vivid recollection of a beautiful summer's day. As well as studying the picture physically, through sketches, x-rays, and accounts of its painting (and repainting), the lecture reflects on how Constable used poetry and the work of historic and contemporary artists to build a richly suggestive atmosphere into this homely rural episode.

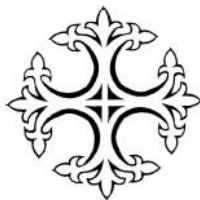

## **CHANGES TO THE STAGECOACH S7 BUS TIMETABLE**

Stagecoach are making some relatively minor timing changes for reliability purposes to the **S7** bus route, with the major change being that the service is withdrawn from Woodstock in the very early mornings and in the evenings.

They've made this decision because turning buses in Woodstock market place was opposed by local residents and traders and there was an incident resulting in an alternative being required, which was not cost-effective and involved using the turning area at Wootton (north of Woodstock).

These changes are expected to be in place from **Sunday 10th March**.

The **S7** will no longer serve Oxford rail station and will now terminate at Magdalen Street East, Oxford city centre on all journeys, and begin the Witney bound trip from bus stop **C4 on Magdalen Street West (outside the Randolph Hotel)**.
